Submission Module Opens: November 2018

Deadline for Speaker Applications: December 19, 2018

Speaker Notification and Invitation: May – August 2019

All application completed by December 19, 2018 will be considered by the SPI and ESI Core Committee and may be invited to speak at that body's discretion through August 2019.

Speakers may also be invited to speak at a regional Solar Power Event by SEIA, SEPA, or conference planning staff.

Policies:

- Each subject matter expert accepts full responsibility for their presentation, and must retain full copyright of his/her presentation. By submitting an application, subject matter experts consent and authorize the conference organizers to publish biographical and presentation information in any conference publications.
- Once your application has been completed, you may continue to revise it until the submission deadline.
- SPI and ESI reserves the right to reject any speaker for failure to comply with submission guidelines.
- Due to the large number of applications received for these events we are unable to provide feedback or notification of the status of an application to speak at SPI, ESI, or a regional event.

Submitter Responsibilities

Being selected as a speaker at SPI, ESI, or the Technical Symposium is a distinguished honor and opportunity to build your credibility as a thought leader in the renewable energy community. To this end, the event education staff, professionals with experience who have developed a number of resources to help develop great presentations, will work closely with invited speakers and moderators to ensure a quality educational session is delivered.

Please notify the education team of any changes, additions, or corrections as they occur. Invited speakers who are not able to attend must notify staff immediately. Replacement presenters may be suggested; however, staff reserves the right to modify or cancel any session based on a change in the presenters.

- Participate in session planning calls. We anticipate at least three pre-planning calls between June and September.
- **Speakers must register by August 30, 2019.** Speakers may register for any pass. Speakers are eligible for a deeply discounted Full-Conference pass, and includes access to networking events (opening reception, block party) and all education sessions.

Step-by-Step Submission Guide

STEP 1:

Log in or Create an Account

If you have submitted a presentation for SPI or ESI in the past three years, please use your previous credentials. If you've forgotten, the system will send you a reminder via the forgot your password tool. If you are new, please create an account and then follow the instructions to set up a login and change your password.

STEP 2:

Start a New Submission

- Enter in a submission title as First Name Last Name and Company of the Speaker (150 character maximum) Do not use all uppercase letters
- Select submission type: Speaker/Moderator

STEP 3:

Presenter Profile

Please enter the Speaker/Moderator contact and professional information. This information will be used by organizers as it is entered.

It is imperative that the email address you enter is correct, as all correspondence regarding submissions will be sent to this email address through the online submission module.

If you are filling out the form on behalf of an individual please include your contact information as the administrative assistant to be automatically copied on all emails sent through our speaker system.

Frequently Asked Questions

How long is each speaking slot?

At Solar Power International, we have many different speaking formats, including:

- QuickTalks: 15 minutes plus 10 minutes for questions by a single speaker on a narrow topic (like TEDTalks).
- Show Floor Education: Typically 30 minute cutting-edge topic presentations.
- Concurrent/Seminar Sessions: These sessions are 60 or 90 minutes. Each session could have a single speaker or up to four. Audience interaction is essential during a panel.

Does speaking at SPI or ESI have any cost for my company?

There is no cost for your company. Accepted speakers receive a significantly discounted Full Conference pass.

What advice do you have for creating a successful application?

- **Submit it on time.** The education programming timeline starts 10 months before the show, so plan ahead. Requests to speak after the deadline are rarely included in the program.
- **Submit a complete application.**

- **What makes you unique?** Include content in your application that separates you from other potential speakers.
